## Four Corners Activity: Social Compact



How it works:

- 1. Post several statements on the board. Based on their thoughts, students will move to a corner of the room that most aligns with their opinion.
- 2. Those individuals that strongly agree *or* strongly disagree will need to formulate an argument.
- 3. Each group will need to come up with an argument and select a spokesperson.
- 4. Each group will state their argument in an effort to sway those individuals that are in the agree and disagree groups to join their side.
- 5. After the statements have been made, the agree and disagree groups will move to their chosen corner.
- 6. Teachers: you may choose to keep score if your students are motivated by competition.

Sample statement: College should be free for all citizens of the United States. Do you feel passionate about this statement? Are you "on the fence"?

Sample statements

- The purpose of a government is to protect a citizens' rights.
- All people should be free and equal, without social classes or social hierarchies.
- Humans are naturally selfish.
- If the people do not agree with the government then the people have the right to speak up and demand change, even if it means they're rebelling.
- There should always be a balance of power between friends.
